

JOBS coding for Domestic Violence:

Activity/Step Code	Domestic Violence Intervention (DV)
Purpose	To keep clients, who are experiencing a domestic violence situation, safe and stable
Hour/Time Limitation	Non-countable activity
Appropriate Case Plan Assignments for Which Attendance Can Be Given	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. working with DV service providers, support groups, advocates, etc. 2. location of safe housing or relocation activities 3. court/legal appointments or activities 4. medical/counseling appointments related to DV
Possible Attendance Source Documentation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. provider reporting 2. client self-reporting in accordance with local district policy 3. TRACS narrative of client discussions

JOBS Participation Requirements for Victims of Domestic Violence:

Victims of domestic violence are not exempt from the Federal work participation rate, however, both State and Federal law allow us to waive JOBS participation (for as long as necessary) when such participation would put a client at risk of further domestic violence. These waivers must be tracked (see tracking elements below) and reported to the Fed's on an annual basis. If the State is unable to meet the required Federal work participation rate, the number of domestic violence waivers will be considered in determining reasonable cause for failing to meet that rate.

DV Intervention Activity Code	If activity is open with attendance
DVS coded on UCMS	If within 90 day TA-DVS eligibility period
Any DV waiver coded on the PDP in TRACS	*For as long as waiver is in place *Waivers should be reviewed at a minimum of every six months
