Tool	Purpose
DHS 415F – Application (TANF & TA-DVS)	<p><u>Page 1 - Section: Do you have an emergent need?</u> Q6. Do you need to get away from an abusive or unsafe situation Q7. Does your partner make you afraid by threatening, yelling or physically hurting you or your children?</p> <p><u>Page 6 – Section: Tell us about any parents not living in your household:</u> Q2. Do you think this parent might try to harm you or the child if we try to establish the parent’s identity and we pursue child support and health care coverage?</p> <p>Page 7 – Section: Tell us about your households medical insurance: Q2. If yes, would pursuing this health insurance put you or the child’s safety at risk?</p>
DHS 7802 – Safety Assessment	Optional use tool that can be used to screens for domestic violence related factors
DHS 7809 – DV Quick Reference Card	Optional use tool that was developed as a quick reference guide for up-front staff to screen & respond to DV cases
DHS 7823 – My Self Assessment	<p><u>Page 6: Things I Don’t like...</u> *having others controlling my life</p> <p><u>Page 8: My Strengths...</u> *I have been able to keep myself and my children safe</p> <p><u>Page 9: Problems I have to Solve....</u> *an abusive or unsafe situation *fear of partner or household member</p> <p><u>Page 10: Help I may need...</u> *help with relationship skills *help to leave an abusive situation</p> <p><u>Page 11: I’m working with or have worked with...</u> *Domestic Violence Services</p>
