Discussion/Interpretation: I-B.1.6 Behavior Intervention is being revised to provide clarity to Department oversight of children with difficult to manage behaviors. The revisions are intended to provide behavior intervention services to the child with the least intrusive interventions that will provide safety for the child.

I-E.3.3.1 Psychotropic Medication Management rules are being revised to provide clarity in responsibility for Department oversight of children in the care or custody of the Department who are prescribed or administered psychotropic medication. The revisions are intended to provide medical services to the child with the least intrusive interventions that meet the best interests of the child.

I-E.8, Educational Services for a Child in Substitute Care is being revised as a result of HB 3075 passed in the 2005 Legislative session.

Implementation/Transition Instructions: These rules are being filed with ample time to provide feedback. All feedback will be reviewed and considered. After final changes are made, the final version of the rules will be posted for review with ample time to become familiar with the rule before effective dates.

Training/Communication Plan: Initial training on these rules will be offered through video conferencing in December, 2006. Ongoing training strategies are being developed.
