This message is a reminder to staff to be sure they provide new ERDC clients with information on H1N1. Clients should also be directed to share that information with their child care providers.

Providers and others with regular contact with infants under the age of 6 months are considered a high priority group for H1N1 vaccines. This is to protect the health of those infants who are unprotected against H1N1 and are too young to be vaccinated.

For your convenience, here are copies of the H1N1 information [letter](#) and [flu fact sheet](#) recently sent to staff in an Information Memorandum on October 15, 2009, (IM [SS-IM-09-055](#)). The letter contains Public Health's flu hotline number and website address. The H1N1 information letter and fact sheet were also sent in early October to all self-sufficiency clients and child care providers active as of September 1, 2009.
