As of September 1, 2012, Health Share of Oregon (previously Tri-County Medicaid Collaborative) Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) will begin serving Medicaid/CHIP members in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington counties. Health Share of Oregon (HSO) is a partnership of:

- Care Oregon;
- Tuality;
- Kaiser;
- Providence.

As of September 1, 2012, members who were enrolled in any of the above Managed Care Organizations (MCO) will be enrolled in the corresponding CCO. The CCO enrollment will display as:

- Health Share – Care Oregon;
- Health Share – Tuality;
- Health Share – Kaiser;
- Health Share – Providence.

HSO is the CCO, but the individual plans within HSO will continue serving members in their current service areas. By the end of the year, HSO will have a technology solution in place that allows it to manage member distribution on its own, at which point DHS/OHA staff will simply enroll members into “Health Share of Oregon.”

Until HSO integrates its technology, workers will:

- Continue to enroll members in the individual plans as usual. Members will need to identify which plan within HSO they would like.
- Continue to process plan change requests as usual (see [DMAP IM 12-024](#) for plan change options and criteria).

Important Note: *The individual plans within HSO will be coordinating with one another as much as possible during this transition process. If a worker feels that a plan change request was prompted by an issue that could be resolved by coordination within HSO, the worker should provide this information to HSO Plan Coordinator [Marilyn Wade](#).*
