SPD Adult Protective Services (APS) is offering a Netlink training on the changes to OAR Chapter 411, Division 20 rules that were effective July 1, 2010 to SPD/AAA:

- APS Supervisors
- APS Specialists and
- APS Screeners

The title of the training is: New General Adult Protective Services Rules and Abuse Definitions.

Fred Steele will present the new rules and abuse definitions. Allison McKenzie and Valerie Eames will answer facility and community APS questions. The training will concentrate primarily on the following:

- New abuse definitions and the changes to previous abuse definitions.
- New definitions of "adult", "services", and amended "disability" definition.
- New law enforcement reporting requirements,
- Multidisciplinary Teams (MDT's) requirements,
- Added mandatory reporters,
- New confidentiality exceptions for MDT's, governmental agencies, and disclosing conclusions of community reports,
- Repeal of OAR 411 Division 21, plus
- Focus on perpetrator conduct to determine substantiation.

The training is two hours long and is scheduled for three dates in September and one in October. There are thirty (30) slots available for each session and you may register as a group.

**Course Synopsis:** This training covers the changes in the new permanent administrative OAR Chapter 411, Division 20 rules that were effective July 1, 2010. Changes include new definitions, new law enforcement reporting requirements, Multidisciplinary Teams (MDTs), added mandatory reporters, repeal of OAR 411 Division 21, plus new and amended definitions of perpetrator-related abuse. In addition, the training discusses new procedures of using elements and perpetrator conduct model to determine substantiation.
