Message: In March, 2013, stakeholders approached ODDS suggesting the merits of developing an ISP that was universal to everyone receiving Oregon's Medicaid funded I/DD services. The effort was launched, with active representation from all I/DD service sectors, self advocates, advocacy agencies, and family members.

Training on the new ISP and ISP processes will be deployed on a regional basis and targeted to the following audiences:

- * Individuals and families: Presented in partnership with local family networks and FACT
- * SC/PAs: Focusing on the case management responsibilities of facilitating the ISP process
- * Foster Providers: Focusing on responsibilities for contributing to the development

and implementation of ISPs

* Provider Organizations (24 hour residential; supported living; employment and community engagement) focusing on responsibilities of contributing to the development and implementation of the ISP.

Services Coordinators are invited to attend a Foster Provider or Provider training in their area to hear expectations communicated to providers. Licensing and Quality Assurance staff will also participate in as many trainings as possible.

The Oregon ISP team will be training in the following locations and dates:

January 26-30: Portland/Metro & Salem

February 9 - 13: Bend and Willamette Valley

February 17-20: Grants Pass, Medford and Klamath Falls

February 23 - 27: Salem & Albany

March 9 - 13: Pendleton & Portland/Metro

March 16-20: Eugene

March 23-27: Portland/Metro

Registration is required to attend each training. Due to limited space in some venues, the number of agency/provider representatives may be restricted to assure participation by each agency within a region.

New ISPs that are developed after April 1, 2015 must use the new ISP materials and processes. Please consider that information as you schedule yourself into training.
