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The PACE Model

PACE is a Medicare and Medicaid national program that offers an array of health and wellness services in a consolidated **all-inclusive** service model.

Medicare and Medicaid funds cover all medically necessary services.
There are no co-pays or deductibles.

Medicare recipients pay a monthly premium for the long-term care and drug benefits.

Recipients can also pay privately for the PACE program if they do not qualify for Medicare or Medicaid.

Services are coordinated with the service recipient and their team of healthcare professionals referred to as an Interdisciplinary Team.

The PACE Recipient & Care Team


The PACE Service Recipient is:

- ☞ 55 years old or older
- ☞ Living in a PACE service area
- ☞ Able to reside safely in the community
- ☞ At Nursing Home Level of Care (SPL 1-13)



The PACE Interdisciplinary Team may include:

- ☞ Medical Doctors
- ☞ Registered Nurses
- ☞ Licensed Therapists
- ☞ Licensed Social Workers
- ☞ Therapeutic Aides
- ☞ Dietitians
- ☞ Other Relevant Healthcare Professionals



PACE Across the Nation

PACE is a national program currently available in 31 states.

Approximately 23,000 people nationwide participate in a PACE program.

Oregon's PACE program is one of the first and largest in the country.

Currently Oregon PACE service areas include *Multnomah* and *Clatsop* counties and parts of *Washington* and *Tillamook* counties with expansion efforts currently underway in *Clackamas* county.

Approximately 1,100 Oregonians participate in the PACE program.

PACE In Oregon

The State of Oregon supports the expansion of the PACE program and PACE providers statewide.

The Department of Human Services-Office of Aging and People with Disabilities currently contracts with Providence Health & Services to provide PACE program services in the current PACE service areas in Oregon.

Providence identifies/brands the PACE program as **Providence ElderPlace**.

Services are delivered by Providence ElderPlace staff and/or contractors that make up a network of hundreds of healthcare providers.


